

Northern Residential Treatment Centres

The Child Protection Worker will utilize Northern Residential Treatment services which meet the therapeutic needs of children and youth in compliance with the *Child and Family Services Act and Regulations*.

REFERENCE

Child and Family Services Act Sections 60-63, 91

PURPOSE

- To ensure quality of care for children and youth receiving services in Northern Residential Treatment Resources.

PROCEDURE

The Child Protection Worker (primary caseworker):

1. Where the case plan includes residential treatment for the child or youth; contact the applicable Northern Residential Treatment Centre (NRTC) and complete the referral process as directed by the intake staff.
2. Collaborate with NRTC's in working with families, community schools, mental health services, RCMP, Courts and other agencies to develop a coordinated treatment plan to address the holistic needs of children and youth;
3. Collaborate with NRTC's to plan for successful reintegration of children and youth back to family and community.

The Courtesy-Supervision Child Protection Worker will:

1. Provide courtesy supervision and maintain minimum contact guidelines for children or youth in care of the treatment resource as required;
2. In conjunction with Primary Child Protection Worker, assist with any case management responsibilities as required;
3. Report any quality of care concerns to the supervisor that arise when accessing Northern Residential Treatment resources.
