



FluWatch is Canada's national surveillance system that monitors the spread of influenza and influenza-like illnesses (ILI).

FluWatch consists of 7 surveillance system components that provide a national picture of influenza activity in Canada:

- Geographic spread of influenza and ILI
- Lab-confirmed detections
- Syndromic surveillance
- Outbreak surveillance



- Severe outcomes surveillance
- Strain characterization and antiviral resistance testing
- Vaccine monitoring

Send FluWatch:

- total # of patients seen per week
- # of ILI cases seen per week

Answer a questionnaire each week that asks if they had cough or fever

 DETECTS flu outbreaks and epidemics



 ACCURATE picture of influenza in Canada because not everyone can or will seek medical advice



 SHOWS Canadians where and when the flu is happening



 EARLY warning if and when outbreaks happen
