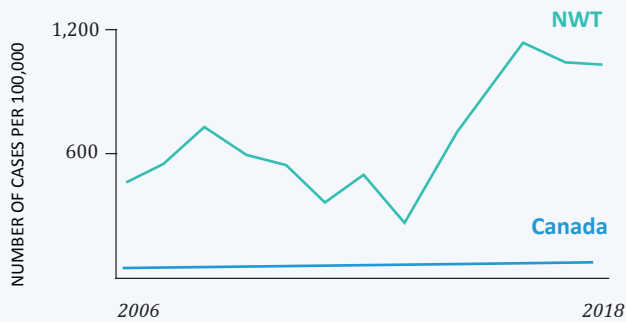

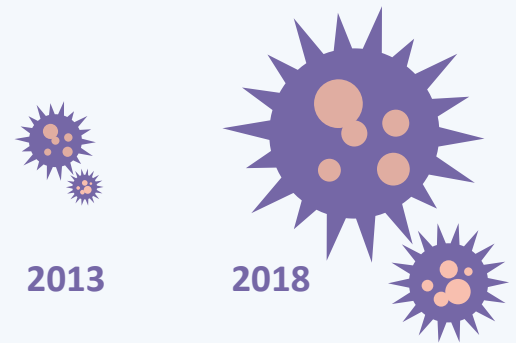
What is gonorrhea?

Gonorrhea is a sexually transmitted infection (STI) spread by anal, vaginal or oral sex with infected partners.

The NWT's current rate is **5x** the 2013 rate.



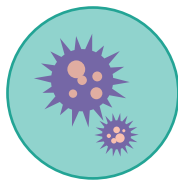
